

# **Horse Awareness - Handy Hints**

When you see a horse on a road, you should slow down to a maximum of 10 mph. Be patient, do not sound your horn or rev your engine.

When approaching, overtaking, passing, always pass wide and slowly, allowing at least 2 metres of space.

Take great care and treat all horses as a potential hazard; they can be unpredictable, despite the efforts of their rider. Do not forget horses are flight animals and can move incredibly quickly if startled.

Pedestrians - Please don't hide from us riders, say hello and make yourself seen, horses will be less scared when they know you're human!

Cyclists - when approaching please say hi!

Drivers - please be patient - some horses cannot trot on hard ground, we will always try to get to a lay-by or safe space to allow other roads users to pass as soon as possible.

Please be mindful that riders can often see and hear potential hazards that may not be apparent to other road users. Please follow any hand gestures to wait to keep everyone safe.

# **WILDLIFE NOTES**

# Winter Tree ID

As winter approaches, wildlife tends to become less visible as many species hibernate or use the longer nights to stay concealed. The colder days also lead trees to lose their leaves and enter dormancy until spring, making it challenging to identify them. In Britain, most tree growth occurs in spring and summer, during which buds form for the following year's growth. With practise these dormant buds can serve as valuable aids in identifying tree species during winter.

Various types of bud, such as terminal, opposite, alternate, alternate zigzag, clustered, or fuzzy, play a role in this identification process. The colour and shape of the bud can also be distinguishing features for identification. Useful field guides can be found online, alternatively the Woodland Trust British Trees app has a useful section on tree buds. Below are brief descriptions of the buds of some common UK species:

- Oak (Quercus robur): Clusters of brown, rounded buds, each with more than three scales.
- Ash (Fraxinus excelsior): Clusters of black rounded buds with more than three scales, positioned opposite each other on the twig.
- Cherry (Prunus avium): Twigs adorned with clusters of red, oval-shaped buds.
- Sycamore (Acer pseudoplatanus): Opposite pairs of green, fat oval buds.
- Field maple (Acer campestre): Older twigs feature corky ridges and small, grey leaf buds.

Additionally, bark characteristics can be useful in distinguishing different tree species:

- Trees with smooth bark: beech, aspen, hornbeam, blackthorn, hazel, white poplar, grey poplar, rowan
- Trees with peeling bark: cherries, birches, planes, field maple, paperbark maple
- Trees with ridged bark: sweet chestnut, oaks, ash, elder, willow, black poplar, lime
- Trees with plated bark: horse chestnut, sycamore, alder, crab apple, hawthorn, yew

# **WILDLIFE NOTES**

# The Hidden World of Fungi

What are fungi?

Fungi are a fascinating group of organisms; they are neither plant nor animal but are essential to all life on Earth. They range from single-celled yeasts to giant puffballs and from the common mushroom to the bizarre 'Archer' found in a garden on Bergholt Road.

We are usually only aware of fungi when they pop their 'heads' above ground in autumn. These 'heads' are their fruiting bodies that we are all familiar with such as mushrooms, toadstools and puffballs. Hidden below ground is the main body of each fungus which consists of a huge network of thin, cotton-like, tubular threads that absorb nutrients from their surroundings, whether that is decaying wood, dung or the soft parts of a dead animal. Many fungi form networks that tap into tree and other plant roots where they act like a super-highway by supplying them with nutrients, while in return the fungal network receives essential sugars to aid its growth.

Without this fungal-plant association there would be no plants, trees, or animals and no humans. Different trees and plants have а close association with particular fungi, for example, as some of you noticed. have mav fruiting bodies of the Fly Agaric fungus (front cover) show a close association with Birch trees. The Beefsteak fungus has а close association with Oak trees.



Fungi suffer from an image problem because many people are not sure which are poisonous and which are not, and because some fungi cause disease. The vast majority, however, are not poisonous and very few cause disease in humans. Without fungi our survival is impossible, they breakdown rock and dead wood to form soil, they provide food and drink, antibiotics such as penicillin and cyclosporine, anti-inflammatories, contraceptives, washing powders and influence the composition of the Earth's atmosphere. To sum up, they provide essential ecosystem services through decomposition, nutrient cycling and soil improvement.






Mild wet weather provides the best environmental conditions for emergence of fungi fruiting bodies as was shown in the autumn of 2015 and, more recently in 2023.

The photographs illustrating this article were taken by the author during the period from

autumn 2015 up to and including autumn 2023.


