WILDLIFE NOTES


We're fortunate enough to live in an area that still attracts a whole host of migratory birds in the summer. From nightingales to cuckoos, turtle doves to swallows, a large number of bird species decide to spend their summers here, with some species being much easier to identify than others. They can appear as early as March, with chiffchaffs and sand martins often the first to arrive. Swallows, willow warblers, blackcaps, redstarts, yellow wagtails, and house martins can be sighted in the early days of April. Later arrivals such as garden warblers, turtle doves, swifts, and spotted flycatchers are also observed. In April, the iconic return of the cuckoo, marked by its unmistakable call, is widely recognised as the definitive signal of spring.


Swallows swifts and martins are some of the more recognisable migratory birds however distinguishing between them can often lead to some confusion. Attached is an image detailing their different features. Note that the long tail streamers present on swallows can often differentiate them with swifts and martins. Swifts are larger than swallows and martins and are brown all over, sometimes paler towards the throat and head. House martins and sand martins are similar in appearance the sand martin is brown above and white below, with a brown band across its breast and the house martin is has a glossier blue-black plumage above with no marking around the breast. It's also important to understand that they nest in very different habitats. Sand martins

nest in burrows, usually dug into sandy banks while house martins build nests out of mud often in the eaves or apex of buildings similar to a swift or swallow.

As with my previous article please use this as a guide when out and about in the village and test your identification skills and possible where report your sightings to the Suffolk **Biodiversity** Information Service (SBIS).



This month sees our **10th Anniversary** of our re-opening as Suffolk's first co-operative pub. 

Following withdrawal of the concrete batching element of the application, Suffolk County Council's Development and Regulation Committee met to consider the planning application on Tuesday 19th March 2024. Residents were very well represented with excellent speeches from Mr Tom Hill KC, Cllr. Dr. Michael Bamford and Cllr Adrian Ward (Copdock and Washbrook PC). There were significant concerns expressed about the effectiveness of the Lorry Management Plan but the majority of County Councillors voted in favour of the application with 6 votes in favour, 2 votes against and 1 abstention.

St Mary's

We're very happy to welcome the Reverend Chris Willis, who is now Rector for the four churches that make up the Benefice, including St Mary's, and were delighted that he attended the Mothering Sunday service as his first visit to us.

The church continues to benefit from the work done in 2020; putting a toilet and a kitchen in, as well as enclosing two arches for a Sunday school and meeting room, had the unexpected benefit of doing wonders for the acoustics. As well as enhancing the experience for more traditional church uses, we have also enjoyed a number of music events, with more booked; a local Johnny Cash tribute group being perennially popular!

Work has started on an attempt to recover details of overgrown and eroded gravestones in the Adopted graveyard, although the wet winter has slowed this down.

Roadworks!!

The village has had more than its fair share of roadworks recently, as gas, water, and electric work has all taken place. We learned the hard way that there is a minimum road width for Highways to be able to install traffic lights, and our main street doesn't meet it; the road has had to be fully closed on a number of occasions. There was particularly а memorable incident when the people working on repairing a gas main went through the water main too, causing extensive flooding, including to the house of a villager who was bridesmaid's storing dresses for her upcoming wedding – all ruined! She has been promised that all will be replaced in time.



Planning

The Neighbourhood Plan continues to prove

its worth, causing an application for a housing estate outside the village Built-Up Area to be rejected. It has not stopped various minor changes in the village, as people build extensions etc, and a couple of changes to field entrances have also been approved. Villagers have also recently completed a consultation exercise, prioritising items for the next phase of the Parish Plan.

School Playing Field

The School Playing Field is now in the ownership of the Parish Council, guaranteeing the security of the green space at the heart of the village. The school have of course retained full access for sports and events.






We are courageous, professional, community, compassionate

I was more than happy to chat and listen and I met some incredible people during that time. Again, some people might not think that that's the role of a Police Officer, again I would disagree. There are many different facets to Policing.

I have been visiting different locations which offer a friendly and welcoming place to go. I work shift work but when I'm able to I will pop along to the Bentley Coffee Club at the Case is Altered. I've been once already and looking forward to going again.
