



# **BENTLEY PARISH COUNCIL**

Bentley Parish Council Meeting took place at Bentley Village Hall at 7.30pm on Thursday 7 July 2022.

**Planning** – One planning decision was received. One planning application was discussed – Councillors queried this application and requested an extension until the September meeting.

**Speedwatch Co-Ordinator** - 20 vehicles reported, 13 at Village Hall and 7 at Capel Road. The highest recorded speed was 44 mph on Capel Road.

**Community Fibre Broadband** – It was reported that this is a non-starter only 36 people had come forward (less than 8%) – at least 50% is required to qualify for grant. This will now be wound up.

- Traffic calming A new solar SID pole has been ordered and a Solar Powered SID
- Playing Field Society –Tudor Re-enactment on 3 & 4 September all in hand.
- Neighbourhood Plan letter sent to Examiner Consultation required re removal of housing allocation policies BEN 1-4.
- Maritime FC to be informed that Councillors are in favour of "some free football in Bentley".



# **BENTLEY WILDLIFE NOTES**

I don't really have any nature news to share so I thought I'd share some of my recent sightings from around the village. These long summer days are the most exciting for spotting wildlife in my opinion. The latest excitement occurred when a Little Owl was spotted near to the village hall, its predictable and repetitive cycle of behaviour made it an easy target to photograph and I've seen some fantastic shots of it over the last few weeks however I haven't had the fortune to get a picture yet. Although introduced to the UK, Little Owls seem to fit comfortably in our biodiversity and are not usually classed as invasive or a pest.

Local woods have also shown great numbers of glow worms as I mentioned in a previous edition. Although common in Britain the numbers seen here in Bentley can easily compete with other sites that boast having great numbers. If you want a chance to spot them head to nearby grassland or woodland after 10pm and keep your eyes peeled for their green neon glow. Glow worms also give us good indication that populations of snails are healthy as this is the main source of food. The larvae will inject the snail with toxic bites, sometimes hitching a ride on the snails' shell till it dies.

It's been disappointing to see so many road-kill hedgehogs this year especially along the main road through Bentley. I'd encourage anyone to help create hedgehog highways throughout their garden by creating holes in fencing between gardens. And although not necessary, feeding stations are another good edition just leaving out some wet dog food can help attract them to your garden. **Fletcher Telling.** 



#### **CLOTHING BANK**

You may have noticed that alongside the glass and paper/card recycling bins at the village hall, there's now a clothing bank. This is for clothing, shoes, handbags & belts in any condition – if they're not reusable, we're told they will be recycled where possible.

Please note this is for these 4 types of item only, not things such as bedding or towels. And like the other bins, if it is full when you visit, please do not leave anything outside the bin but take your items back home, to return when there's space in the bin (or use another bin elsewhere).





Fifty people brought their own food {and drink} which provided an excellent buffet and the music was again provided by the G.R. Disco.


