



BENTLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Bentley Parish Council Meeting took place at Bentley Village Hall at 7.30pm on Thursday 3 November 2022 – preceded by a Playing Field Society meeting.

Planning – One planning decisions was received.

One Planning application was discussed but not voted on – documents would not download - this will be the subject of an Extra Ordinary Meeting to make residents aware of this application to extract, process and sell sand and gravel, process inert waste materials and concrete batching with associated plant and related sales, associated access works. Contact will also be made with surrounding parishes.

Reports were received from County Councillor Georgia Hall, District Councillor Dave Busby, Footpath Warden, and Speedwatch Co-Ordinator.

Presentation – By Mark Pryke Network Service Manager (Ipswich) for Anglian Water & his colleague Grant Tufts - they spoke about how they investigate mains as a business – Proposals currently being looked at and Additional Services. He agreed pipework needed to be replaced at The Link and at the moment is trying to prioritise 400 metres in Capel Road which will affect 3 individual properties and will advise if successful.

Matters discussed:

- Purchase of projector.
- SCC owned copse between Chestnuts and The Corral dead trees are to be removed.
- Wi-fi & Defibrillator at Village Hall Village Hall Trustees will get back to PC in due course
- Half Year Accounts were deferred until December
- Registering Domain name for Bentley PC re .gov e-mail addresses for Clerk & Councillors.
- Improvements to War Memorial –Bench & litter bin to be ordered.
- Traffic calming ANPR is coming to Bentley for one week commencing 14 November 2022
- Playing Field Society Fireworks taking place on Saturday 5 November. Everything is in hand.
- Neighbourhood Plan Referendum is due to take place on 8 December Cllr Moxey is arranging a drop-in evening for anyone who has any questions or may be confused.

SPEEDING IN BENTLEY

We now have 2 **Speed Indicator Devices**, purchased by the Parish Council, positioned at either end of the main road through the village to help reduce speeding traffic.

In addition to this we have a volunteer **Community Speedwatch** team who do an excellent job monitoring the speed of traffic through the village and recording speeding motorists. Last month 6 sessions were held, 1 at the War Memorial, 2 at the Village Hall, and 3 on Capel Road. A total of 56 vehicles were reported, 6 at the War Memorial, 5 at the Village Hall and 45 on Capel Road. The highest recorded speed was 44 mph.

You may also have noticed an Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) camera sited outside the Village Hall last month. Bentley is one of a group of parishes who are trialling this system, as part of the Suffolk Roadsafe Partnership between Suffolk County Council and Suffolk Constabulary. They are sited where

there is a problem with speeding or rat-running on roads with a 30 mph speed limit. Motorists are warned if they are near or over the speed limit as they approach. If a driver continues to ignore the speed limit, the camera will take a picture of the vehicle including their registration number, with the date, time and speed and persistent offenders will be reported to Suffolk Constabulary. The information shared with the police will also help them decide on where speed enforcement vans should be deployed going forward.

BENTLEY WILDLIFE NOTES

Dark skies and wildlife

"Since the invention of the electric light bulb less than a century and a half ago, the night has been steadily disappearing. Nocturnal satellite imagery of our planet reveals the extent to which we have banished darkness". Johan Eklöf.

Artificial light at night (LAN), is harmful to nocturnal animals and has a detrimental effect on short-day plants because it interrupts the natural cycle of day and night which in turn interferes with their body clock hormones (it disturbs their natural circadian rhythm).

At night while we are asleep, one-third of all vertebrates and two-thirds of invertebrates become active after remaining hidden during the day. Their biology has evolved for darkness. Most nocturnal invertebrates use light from the stars or moon as a cue for navigation. LAN can block this light that in turn leads to faulty navigation; an example of this light pollution can be seen at Felixstowe Port. Female glow-worms produce their own light that flashes on and off to attract males but they cannot out-compete artificial light and mating chances are lost. LAN can also change an animals behaviour, for example it attracts insects such as moths and flies which clearly disorientated bash themselves against the light and become burnt or damaged, exhausting themselves and making them vulnerable to predators. Other nocturnal invertebrates that you will all be familiar with are snails, slugs, woodlice, earthworms. Cockroaches are also nocturnal.

Nocturnal vertebrates range from the predators that hunt by night (badgers, bats, foxes, hedgehogs, otters, nightjars and owls) and those that are prey (dormice, moles, rats,

and mice). Short-day plants, for example violets and strawberries, rely on a long period of dark in order to flower normally. Even a short flash of light during the dark period will cause abnormal flowering.

Wanton excess of LAN comes from a wide range of sources, too many to mention here, examples are offices and shops, spotlights, house outside lights, cars, smart phones, tablets and torches. LED light causes the most harm.

All the animals and plants referred to above have been recorded in Bentley.



OBSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC FOOTWAYS

Bentley Parish Council respectfully reminds parishioners to check that their hedgerows and plants are not, inadvertently, obstructing or impeding pedestrian access along public footways. Council asks that any such growth (width and height) is cut back in order to avoid any unintentional accident or injury to pedestrians, cyclists or motor vehicles.

If any parishioner is aware of a particular problem site, please notify the Clerk in order that appropriate action may be taken.

BENTLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - PARISH REFERENDUM

People in the Parish who are entitled to vote, will soon receive, or have already received, a polling card from Babergh District Council.

Why is this and what are you voting for?

In 2018 the Bentley Neighbourhood Plan process was begun by the Parish Council, with the help of a committee made up of local residents. The Neighbourhood Plan gives you, the local community, the power to set out a vision for the Parish area and to include planning policies that can shape growth and influence the type of development where you live and work.

Following extensive consultation, the Neighbourhood Plan has now successfully passed an Independent Examination and has been approved to go forward to a referendum on Thursday 8 December 2022.

The referendum process will operate in the same way as an election. If you're on the electoral register you can either cast your vote at the Polling Station, located at the Village Hall, or if you have a Postal Vote, return it as instructed.

Those entitled to vote will be asked to answer 'Yes' or 'No' to the following question:

'Do you want Babergh District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Bentley to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

If more than 50% vote 'Yes", Babergh District Council will be legally required to 'make' (adopt) the Neighbourhood Plan as part of its planning framework. This means the planning policies of the Plan will have to be taken into account as part of future planning applications.

Applications will be considered at the next suitable Parish Council Meeting

ELIGIBILITY OF CANDIDATES - The Parish Council is able to consider any person to fill a vacancy provided that:

- he/she is 18 or over; and
- he/she is a British citizen, a qualifying Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any other member state of the European Union; and at least one of the following apply:
- he/she is an elector for the Parish and continues to be an elector; or
- has resided in the Parish for the past twelve months or rented/tenanted land in the Parish; or
- has had his/her principal or only place of work in the Parish for the past twelve months; or
- has lived within three miles of the Parish for the past twelve months.

There are certain disqualifications for being a Parish Councillor, of which the main are (see s80 of the Local Government Act 1972):

- holding a paid office or employment under the Parish Council;
- bankruptcy;
- having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months, without the option of a fine during the preceding five years; or
- being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal electoral practices.

Remembering your Faithful Friend this Christmas The Dogs Trust

Christmas may be a time to remember family and friends - but Dogs Trust Snetterton is also asking local dog owners to remember their four-legged friends this festive time, with a Canine Care Card.

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.



It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed, loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.
