

SERVANT QUEEN

Sermon at St Mary's Church the day before the funeral of HMQ Elizabeth II 18th September 2022

Mark 10.41-45 and 1 Peter 4.8-11

Prayer:

Show us your ways, Lord, teach us your paths. Guide us in your truth and teach us, for you are God our Saviour, and our hope is in you all day long.(based on Psalm 25.4-5; the original was part of HM's preparation for her coronation)

Probably the most quoted and screened act of the Queen's life is that 21st birthday radio broadcast:

"It is very simple. I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it." (radio broadcast from South Africa, 21st birthday April 1947)

To Elizabeth, leadership (and monarchy, which came later) meant dedicating her life to the service of others. She was also one who, increasingly frequently in recent years, spoke publicly of her reliance on the teaching of Jesus, and the strength given her by God, to know her role and to fulfil it.

This is the essence of the Coronation Service. Incidentally, this was not a new form of service, for her, in 1953. It was essentially the same service, from the coronation of Edgar (Anglo-Saxon King of All the English) in 973 AD, devised by Dunstan, Archbishop of Canterbury at the time. It's a thousand years old. It's instructive to look at what happens in it.

The Queen enters, walks past everyone and everything, and kneels to pray in silence, alone, at the altar rail. She wears no symbols of status, just a plain, simple white dress. She comes with nothing, other than a willing allegiance and commitment to God, demonstrated in that prayer, and a readiness to uphold law and justice expressed in the Oath that follows.

She is given a Bible: 'to keep your Majesty ever mindful of the law and the Gospel of God as the Rule for the whole life and government of Christian Princes, we present you with this Book, the most valuable thing that this world affords. Here is Wisdom; This is the royal Law; These are the lively Oracles of God.'

Then comes the Anointing: You never see this, because she did not permit it to be filmed, though you may see the canopy being erected around her. This is the most personal, probably to Elizabeth the most important, element in the whole process. This is anointing for self-sacrificial service. To serve, not to be served. Oil was used, through Old Testament times and after, to consecrate kings, priests and prophets, as a symbol of the Holy Spirit. So the anointing includes a prayer similar to one used in our Confirmation services.

Only after these statements, that the wisdom you need is the Word of God, and the power you need is the Spirit of God, only then come the tokens of authority.

Even then, they are essentially tokens of service of God and of his people

- The Sword of justice to protect, restore, reform; to help and defend the vulnerable;
- The Armills, or **Bracelets**, of sincerity and wisdom, tokens of the Lord's protection ... and of the bond uniting monarch and people;
- The **Orb** of the world set under the Cross, a reminder that 'the whole world is subject to ... Christ our Redeemer';
- The Ring of dignity, the seal of Faith: 'being rich in faith and blessed in all good works':
- The Royal **Sceptre**, representing power and justice. It has a cross on it;
- The Rod of equity and mercy; it has a white enamelled dove on it;- justice and mercy, Word and Spirit;
- The **Crown** of righteousness, faith and good works all by the grace of God. The wearer is accountable to God, empowered by God.

This is how we see monarchy; not dictatorial nor despotic nor privileged, but about being consecrated for responsibility, duty and service. Which is why, when you look at our late Queen's reign, you see it characterised by dedication, duty, discipline and devotion to service

Where does all this come from? Her Majesty said (in 2012): "God sent his only son 'to serve, not to be served'. He restored love and service to the centre of our lives in the person of Jesus Christ." She also said that this was not a role she had chosen, but one that she had been called to - called to be a Servant Queen, living by God's Word, empowered by God's Spirit to follow the example of Jesus.

And what does this all say to us? That we are called to be a Serving People, likewise living by God's Word, empowered by God's Spirit to follow the example of Jesus.

'Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ.' 1 Peter 4.8-11

Love each other. Note that love is essentially practical, more a matter of action than feeling. It covers a multitude of sins, so - be ready to forgive. We all saw the Queen shaking hands with Martin McGuinness

Offer hospitality. How open is your home - or is it your castle, with the drawbridge usually up?

Use whatever gift you have received to serve others. God spreads his gifts around, so that his kingdom only grows as we all play the part he calls us to. As a predecessor of mine in Beccles used to say, 'What, on Earth, are you doing, for Heaven's sake?' (the intonations are key at this point – hence the extra commas, plus an emphasis on 'Heaven's')

It's worth adding in here that this includes gifts that you may not have discovered yet.

It's often the case that we see other people's gifts more clearly than we see our own; so let someone tell you what your gifts are! Then activate your gifts, whether in words of encouragement or acts of kindness.

The Coronation Service, which our late Queen took utterly seriously, sets out the order: God's Word, God's power, God's people. Where the Church fails, where society fails, where families fail, where people fail, it is often where they fail to follow this order - God's Word, God's power, God's people - in obedience, trust, service. And where they succeed, it is usually because the priorities are in the right order.

Let us be a Serving People, living by God's Word, empowered by God's Spirit to follow the example of Jesus in serving his people. We know it can be done. We have just seen it done.

Royal Connections

Our village has welcomed so many new residents since our Community Shop was conceived and built in 2015/16 that a little history may be interesting. With The Case is Altered, our Community Pub, purchased by over 200 village shareholders in 2014 it soon became apparent we wanted a Shop as well!

How to find £100,000+ Shop Funding?

The Pub asked for volunteers to design and build a new shop in the Pub grounds. With Village fund raising exhausted the task of raising another £100,000+ to build a new village shop was daunting and involved looking elsewhere but by making many applications and approaches, steady progress was being made.

The Prince's Countryside Fund.

This Fund was established by Prince Charles to help rural areas and our funding was

transformed by an invigorating catalyst when on December 16th 2015 the The Princes Countryside Fund letter arrived making a very generous grant of capital and unusually, a two year revenue grant. This made sure our shop was sustainable in its early years while we all learned how to "play Shops". The round logo of the Prince's Countryside Fund is on the outside of the shop in recognition.

Our shop was formally opened by Lady Clare, Countess of Euston, the Lord Lieutenant of Suffolk, who is the Monarch's personal representative in Suffolk

PROPOSED SOLAR FARM - GROVE FARM

Information from the developer's website - https://www.grovesolarfarm.com/the-project

The Project

The proposed development shall cover an area of approximately 116.6 acres/48.4 hectares, contained within the existing field boundaries.

The freestanding solar panels are constructed from toughened glass set in an aluminium frame. The panels would be arranged in rows on an east to west alignment facing south to maximise their exposure to sunlight.

The panels themselves shall be mounted on frames with a front height of approximately 0.8m and a maximum back panel height of approximately 2.7m, which shall result in a tilt angle of approximately 15 degrees.

The rows of panels would be set back from a security fence to prevent overshadowing from adjoining vegetation, and to provide a wildlife buffer. There would also be a separation of 3-4m between each row, again to ensure that the panels are not overshadowed.

The proposed solar panels are fixed into position through piles driven into the ground. No concrete foundations are required and little excavation is therefore necessary.

To ensure the security of the solar farm equipment, security fencing shall be erected around the site boundary to restrict access to the site. This would comprise of 2.4m high deer or similar fencing, which has been selected to minimise the visual impacts of the fencing in keeping with the site's location.

Project Location

The site consists of fields to the north of Potash Lane in the Parish of Bentley. The nearest settlement is Bentley village, 600 m south of the site - see map below.



BENTLEY WILDLIFE NOTES

Is There Trouble With Badgers?

We have many Badgers in Bentley. The name of Brockley Wood, which is in the north of the village reflects the Old English name Brocc for the badger and suggests that we have recognised them living here for many centuries. We can find woodland badger colonies, called setts, with large burrows and the tracks of active animals on our walks. Badgers tend to use regular tracks and they are houseproud animals. They regularly change the bedding material in their setts, and use a communal toilet dug in the ground as a latrine.

We seldom see them at large, as they come out late in the evening, as dark falls. This is a strategy which has helped them stay away from daytime conflict with people. They are very shy and easily disturbed. Their presence is, however, very evident, as they are frequent victims of roadkill. Contrary to myth, they do not truly hibernate, but their night-time activity is less easy to see in winter, since we, as a species tend to hibernate, in the sense that we spend less time outdoors after dark in winter. Badgers are Britain's largest carnivorous animal, but their diet is largely of earthworms. They also dig up wasp and bumble bee colonies to feed on the wasp and bee grubs and seem remarkably immune to the stings of the occupants. continued overleaf..



A dog of ours went too close to a recently dug up wasp nest and emerged with many wasps in his fur and was badly stung. They are omnivorous and will happily gorge on fruit, such as plums, in season. They will seek other animal prey when times are hard. They will dig up beetle grubs – a favourite being stag beetle larvae and will also take small mammals. Whilst they will happily share a feeding station with hedgehogs, and I've seen much video footage to prove it, they will occasionally turn on their companions, and have the power to overcome the hedgehogs defences and eat them too.

Their major contentious problem is their link with bovine T.B. This is a very 'chicken and egg' dilemma. If there were no cattle, badgers would not get bovine T.B., but they can catch T.B. from cattle, and transmit it back. The evidence from national badger cull trials is debatable. Viewing the evidence, it is far from clear whether the killing of badgers in slaughter areas has caused a reduction in bovine T.B., and government policy now seems more directed at vaccinating both cattle and badgers. Suffolk, and East Anglia generally are not a high-risk area for bovine T.B. so there is no excuse to cull them here.

Badgers are a protected species under a protection act of 1992, but badger baiting with dogs forced to fight animals dug out of their setts continues in parts of the country. They continue to be poisoned illegally.

It seems paradoxical, and a shame that Britain's enduring and handsome land mammal should be persecuted and culled to eradication, while elsewhere attempts are made to re-wild the countryside and re-introduce such previously wiped-out species such as beavers and wolves.

Neighbourhood Plan

I was hoping to give you news of a referendum date this month - we are so close I can taste it! - but we are not quite there. What's happened since the last Bugle is that the Inspector has finished her work and has decreed that the Neighbourhood Plan can go forward to referendum, given a very few minor changes and a couple of major ones which reflect Babergh's failure to get the District-level Plan passed last December.

She has handed over control of the process to Babergh's Neighbourhood Plan officer, and he and our consultant are bouncing document versions backwards and forwards with the aim of coming up with a document that reflects both our original intent and the Inspector's comments. It's not until that process completes that we can move on to referendum, but we are very, very nearly there!

Babergh will control the referendum date, but once the document has been finalised, there is a mandatory 6-week period during which everyone can read the Plan; then we will hire the Village Hall for the day and there will be a vote, exactly as if it were an election day. We are currently working to get that process started during October, for a vote this year.

A simple majority of YES votes over NO ones mean that the Plan becomes law, and its Policies must be taken into account for any planning application.

It's been a long old process, but we should be done and dusted before Christmas! (Fingers crossed!)
